
# FLIGHT OF FIVE HISTORIC LOCKS DEMONSTRATIONS



### Flight of Five Demonstrations

- The Locks Heritage District Corporation (LHDC), an all-volunteer organization, oversees the operation of the historic locks
- Two rehabilitated locks were dedicated in September 2014, demonstrations have been conducted since 2015
- Three of the five historic locks are now rehabilitated and will be operated by volunteers in the summer of 2021
- Demonstrations are scheduled every Saturday from July 3 through
   September 18, with one last demonstration on October 2 (Locktoberfest)
- \* Lock tender schedule is maintained by Dave Chatt and emailed
- Volunteers are asked to arrive by 10:30 am to set up, and are usually on site until 1:30 pm to dismantle and store equipment
  - For new teams, volunteers are asked to arrive by 10:00 for 30 minutes of training prior to setup
  - > The actual demonstrations are scheduled from 11:00 1:00

### Flight of Five Demonstrations

- \* A team of lock tenders consists of 12 people each week, plus the team leader
- It is not uncommon to have a team of less than 12 from a specific organization. The rest of the 12 are made up of individual volunteers.
   A team can be any number between 2 and 12.
- If there is a specific date that works for your team, I can reserve that date for you. The schedule will be issued in late April or in May via email.
- \* Your team only needs to commit to one date. You can commit to more if desired.
- \* Teams are encouraged to wear their own team shirts to get exposure for their organization
- Demonstrations are not held in inclement weather either cancelled or cut short due to lightning, rain, or other unsafe conditions

## Flight of Five Demonstrations

- Operations are coordinated by a team leader, who is an experienced lock tender assigned to each demonstration
- Team leader will conduct a team meeting just prior to demonstration
  - Review safety protocol
  - Make assignments ask who would like to do what
- The team leader will direct the demonstration when to open/close valves, when to open/close gates, when to move boat
- \* Team leader may rotate assignments as individuals desire
- Water and snacks will be provided, volunteers can bring their own if desired
- Rest rooms are available in the Discovery Center

# Volunteer Responsibilities

- Observe all safety protocols including:
  - Wear a mask covering mouth and nose (bring your own)
  - Wear a Personal Floatation Device (PFD) provided by LHDC
  - > Others as provided during training
- Wear team shirts if available, long or short pants are OK
- Wear comfortable shoes providing good footing no flip flops
- \* Arrive on time
- Only perform tasks with which one is comfortable, there are tasks for different levels of physical activity
- Tasks vary in physical activity from easy (managing visitors) to moderate (operating the wooden gates, pulling the Erie Traveler through the locks)
- \* Have Fun Enjoy re-creating Lockport's history!

### Volunteer Tasks

- \* Assist with setup and storage of demonstration equipment
- Operate inlet valves to control water flow into locks
- Operate weir valves to control water level between locks
- Open and close the historic 5 ton wooden miter gates
- Operate outlet valve for water flow out of locks
- ♦ Pull Erie Traveler from lock to lock
- \* Manage lines and boat while on board Erie Traveler
- Manage visitors
  - > Insure visitors remain in safe areas
  - > Answer questions or direct them to a LHDC representative
- \* Maintain a clean environment
- Periodically wipe surfaces per COVID protocol
