OF NOTE:

- **The Family Empowerment Center at Cornerstone Arena is being outfitted in anticipation of an October 22nd opening. The Family and Community Liaison position will soon be filled (fingers crossed) and the MBK Parent Advocates will be assuming their roles at the FEC once it is opened.**
- **BestSelf will be providing school-based mental health clinics at Charles Upson and Emmet Belknap this year with the goal of expanding these services to all school buildings over the course of the next few years.**
- **With the recent award of the School Mental Health Supports for School Districts Grant, LCSD will be able to expand upon the existing mental health services already provided at Charles Upson and Emmet Belknap...this is tremendous news!**
- **Community partnerships provide more opportunities and better services for students, families, and staff...LCSD has created new, or expanded upon, 3 community organization partnerships that have the potential to be game-changers: University of Buffalo, EPIC for Children, and COMPEER Niagara. These partnerships have resulted in 1 new Computer Science Pathway program at LHS and the potential for 2 wrap around service programs that support student and family mental and behavioral health and substance use, and child and youth learning and development. These programs and partnerships support LCSD's Community Schools initiative.**
